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A-GROUP 6 SOUNDS:

box, wax, mix, next, sixteen, boxing

ch

chap, chips, rich, sandwich, children

sh

shut, shelf, shock, shook, brush, smash

th"hard (voiced) th"

this, that, then, with, them, than, within

th "soft(unvoiced) th"

thick, thud, thump, tooth faith, length, north

<u>We do not have a specific rule to differentiate between them, but there are exceptions.</u>





<u>There are 5 exceptions that should help you to determine whether a th should be voiced or voiceless:</u>

1-Between two vowels th is voiced:

- mother, brother, weather, etc.
- 2- When followed by a silent e, th is voiced:
- Ex. bath (unvoiced); bathe (voiced)
- 3- At the beginning of functional words th is voiced:
- Ex. In the article the and in the words this, that, these, those, then, than, they, them, their, there, therefore.
- 4- At the end of the word or before a consonant, th is unvoiced:
- myth, mouth, mouthful, bath, truthful, throw, etc
- 5- At the beginning of most other words, th is unvoiced:
- thunder, theatre, think, etc.
